

# **TUTORING PROGRAMS**

#### Middle School Grades 5-8

Study Stars is our in-center, homework study period that occurs on every Monday-Thursday from 3-4:15pm. During this time youth will have access to a surplus of different school supplies and two staff members for help. If a youth takes part in this program they can earn rewards for being successful and completing their homework or other brain-teasing activities.



#### High School Grades 9-12

Our Education room is open and available each night for any youth that might need a quiet place to get their school work done. Staff are available to help youth in any way they can to reach their academic goals.

To assist with the scheduled Early Release Days throughout the school year within the Neenah School District, we will continue to offer our Open Doors program. A current transportation permission slip is required for youth participating in the Open Doors programming.

\*We will only be offering adjusted hours on Early Release Days. The center will be closed on Professional Learning Days (no school days) so that Youth Go staff can utilize that time for trainings, staff development and center wide projects. We may need to make adjustments throughout the school year depending on attendance. We will do our best to communicate with parents when and if any changes are made.

\*Our plan is to serve meals (lunch, a snack and dinner on Early Release Days), provide guided recreation time, offer crafts, and watch movies.

\*This service is only for youth in grades 5-12.





There were parts of Badges for Baseball in the summer of 2023 that brought back memories of the years before the world changed in 2020. The number of participants who signed up for the program in Menasha and Neenah reached 70, the highest combined total since 2019. I was able to bring three very deserving participants to the end of summer camp in Maryland – the first time since 2018. There were also elements of 2023 that set it apart from the previous 13 years. I had the help of 10 high school assistants; two of whom helped at both locations. There were 13 different law enforcement volunteers (from Fox Crossing, Menasha, and Neenah police departments) who spent parts of their Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and one Friday throughout the summer out on the field making a difference in the lives of these youth. Three adult volunteers also got acquainted with the kids from Menasha and Neenah, and shared their knowledge of baseball and life experiences. The Wisconsin Timber Rattlers maintained their consistent support of our program, and helped put a bow on the season with a visit from three current members of the roster. Let's see what 2024 can do to top what was a fantastic 2023. –Timothy




